From the Desk of President Argiris

It is with great satisfaction that I can report that the Village is proceeding with our important downtown developments around the Wheeling Metra Station. The Village worked collaboratively with the local taxing districts to negotiate an intergovernmental agreement to share property tax revenues and pave the way for over \$150 million in new development. This agreement has prevented costly litigation that would have likely driven these new developments away. The Village and the taxing districts worked tirelessly over the past few months to allow each party to achieve positive results for their respective constituents. The result is a collective win for Wheeling residents for years to come. As your Village President, I am very satisfied with the common ground we have found.

Without getting too deep in the financial weeds, the Village, High School District 214, School District 21, the Wheeling Park District, and the Indian Trails Public Library achieved a compromise over the flow of tax revenues during the life of a pair of 23-year Tax Increment Financing (TIF) districts formed to make the new developments possible. Suffice it to say, the negotiations were spirited, with all parties advocating passionately for their positions. On July 21, we reached a tentative intergovernmental agreement, and the respective governing boards of all parties are in the process of approving the agreement as this newsletter goes to press. Special thanks are due to State Representatives Elaine Nekritz, Carol Sente, and David Harris, who helped forge the agreement and kept all parties focused on the big picture.

With those hurdles cleared, the Village Board approved two formal redevelopment agreements regarding major upcoming projects. The first, approved on July 21, was an agreement with Reva Development Partners to build Northgate Crossing, a \$50 million, 288-unit luxury apartment project on the former Kenny Construction site near the center of town. The second, approved on August 4, was an agreement with Urban R2 for the bulk of the Town Center development just east of the Metra station.

The most visible part of the 17-acre Town Center will be 95,000 square feet of retail space on the old Wickes Furniture site next to Village Hall along Dundee Road. Preliminary agreements already have been reached with theater operator Flix Brewhouse, Keefer's Steakhouse, Reza's Mediterranean Restaurant, Red Mango frozen yogurt, and Starbucks. The mixed-use project also envisions a five-story, 300-unit luxury apartment development. A day care facility is also being considered, and other possible tenants include a boutique grocer, a bike shop, and a deli. A village green area with a fountain and other amenities is planned in the middle of the space. Construction is scheduled to start next summer, and is expected to be substantially complete by 2017.


The Village Board also approved a second TIF district for future development near Chicago Executive Airport. This is an area of town that has been long overlooked for development, and now is the time. The airport is a major asset for the village, with the businesses on our side of the airport generating a total of \$1,205,000 per year in sales and property tax revenue for all Wheeling taxing districts. Of that amount, the Village of Wheeling receives approximately \$455,000 per year, which includes the sales tax revenue we receive and our share of the property tax revenue. These businesses also create over 2,400 aviation-related jobs.

Recently it was announced that the airport is in the process of updating their Airport Master Plan. To be eligible to receive Federal Airport Improvement Program funding, the airport is required to maintain and periodically update the Airport Master Plan and Layout Plan, as specified by the FAA. The goal of a Master Plan is to provide the framework needed to guide future airport development that will cost-effectively satisfy aviation demand, while considering potential environmental and socioeconomic impacts. Per FAA guidance, periodic updates of Master Plan elements are typically needed on a five-year cycle for active airports similar to Chicago Executive. While a number of updates and studies have been conducted at Chicago Executive since acquisition by the Village of Wheeling and City of Prospect Heights in 1986, the full Master Plan was completed over 30 years ago. If we are to see what the full potential of the airport can be, this study is absolutely necessary. Any potential development that comes as a result of TIF district funds or the airport Master Plan will need to be approved by both the Wheeling Village Board and the Prospect Heights City Council, both of whom will seriously consider any and all potential impact to their residents.

School is Back in Session: School Zone Safety Reminder

With classes beginning again on August 25, our children will be walking to and from school. The Wheeling police want YOU to be aware of the following:

School Zones: The speed limit in all Wheeling school zones is 20 miles per hour. “School Days” are defined as 7 a.m. – 4 p.m. on days when school is in session and children are present on the sidewalks or in the area. First offenses carry a minimum fine of \$150. A court appearance by violators is required. Court supervision cannot be given to drivers cited for speeding in a school zone.

Stopping for loading and unloading school buses: Illinois law requires that drivers stop and not pass school buses that have their red lights flashing with the stop sign arm extended. Vehicles that are in oncoming traffic in relation to a stopped school bus on a four lane roadway are not required to stop under the law. A court appearance by violators is required. First offenders are subject to a mandatory minimum fine of \$150, are not eligible for court supervision, and will have their driver’s license suspended for a period of three months.

Disobeying a Crossing Guard: Illinois law makes disobeying a crossing guard a moving violation. A court appearance by violators is required. The minimum fine is \$150.


Cellular phone use in a School Zone: Starting on January 1, 2014, Illinois banned the use of all hand-held devices while driving. Only hands-free technology such as speakerphones, Bluetooth, and earpieces are permitted to be used while driving. In a School Zone however, all cell phone use is prohibited while driving, including hands-free technology.

Construction Zones: All cell phone use is prohibited while driving in a highway construction zone, including hands-free technology.

Texting while driving: Texting while driving is prohibited at all times throughout the State of Illinois. The first texting offense is considered an equipment violation that does not affect your driving record. Second and subsequent violations are considered moving violations and will affect your driving record. The fine for a first offense is \$120, per the Cook County Circuit Clerk.

Seat belts: On January 1, 2012, Governor Quinn signed a new law into effect stating that ALL passengers in a vehicle—including adults—must wear a seat belt. This includes back seat passengers.

Please help make Wheeling safe for children walking to and from school by obeying these traffic laws and remaining alert.



Household Chemical Waste

Household products such as cleaners, lawn or garden care products, antifreeze, pesticides, etc., can contain hazardous ingredients that can be harmful to human health and the environment and require proper and safe disposal. It is highly recommended that you purchase limited quantities of household hazardous products so that the amount of hazardous waste produced is limited.

Long-term (permanent) household hazardous waste disposal drop-off facilities are available to Illinois residents at no charge. These permanent facilities are located in Naperville, Rockford, Chicago, and Gurnee (by appointment only). Latex Paint:

Water-based latex paint is not hazardous due to water replacing most of the oil-based components. Therefore, it is not accepted at any Illinois drop-off facilities. The following method is required for proper disposal of latex paints:

- Open paint cans in well-ventilated areas and add an absorbent such as kitty litter, sand, oil-dry, or shredded paper into the cans.
- When the liquid paint is absorbed and the paint is hardened, place lids back on the paint cans and dispose of cans in regular refuse containers (not recycling!).
- If paint cans are full, divide the paint into empty cans to solidify or repeat the absorption process.

Guidelines for Leaf Disposal

Village Code 11.08.100 prohibits the deposit of leaves into streets, roads, or highways and along the shoulder, curb, or edge of any street, road, or highway.

 Leaves intentionally raked into such areas can result in clogged storm sewer drains and subsequent flooding.

 The Village's contract with Waste Management provides an alternate, convenient method to dispose of leaves and other forms of yard waste for single-family residents.

 In addition to two-ply Kraft biodegradable paper yard waste bags, residents may use rigid 32-gallon containers clearly marked with a red "X" around the container.

 Containers and biodegradable bags, when filled, may not exceed 45 pounds in weight. There is no limit to the number of yard waste bags or containers allowed.

 Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.

 Brush must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string. Bundles must not weigh over 45 lbs., exceed four feet in length or two feet in diameter, or contain limbs greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of brush bundles allowed.

 Loose or larger brush or logs will not be collected by Waste Management.

 Yard waste collections conclude on November 30, 2014.

Storm Drain Grate/Inlet Cleaning

Storm drain grates/inlets help collect water which then flows to the nearest stream, river, or lake, and are normally located near the edge of streets or in yards. Grates/inlets obstructed with leaves and other debris (i.e. grass clippings, tree seeds, branches, etc.) do not allow for a continual water flow and may cause localized flooding. Residents who find an obstructed grate/inlet should rake the debris away from the storm drain. Do not stuff the debris into the grate/inlet or blow the debris into the street. Please do not remove debris from grates/inlets during an active storm; standing on or near metal grates in a lightning storm is very unsafe. Depending on the type of debris, it may be disposed of as yard waste or garbage. If there is a larger concern, residents may contact the Public Works Department at 847.279.6900.

The Village encourages residents to help remove debris from storm sewer inlets.

Capital Improvement Projects

The **2014 Sewer Lining Program** will begin late summer or early fall. This project consists of rehabilitating the existing sewer by lining it with a cured-in-place pipe, which eliminates or thoroughly reduces the infiltration of ground water into the system and extends the life of sanitary sewers and deteriorated storm sewer pipes. Multiple locations in East Meadowbrook will be targeted this fall.

The **2014 Sidewalk Removal and Replacement Program** will begin late summer in various locations throughout the village. Public Works continues to compile a list of locations that qualify for this work. If you feel you have a public sidewalk in need of repair, please call the Capital Projects & Design Division at 847.459.2620, and a village inspector will evaluate the sidewalk to see if it qualifies for replacement as funding becomes available.

Parkway Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Tree Removals

The Village of Wheeling continues to be proactive in removing dead and dying parkway trees infested with EAB. Trees that are over 50% dead meet the Village's current criteria for removal. Replacement trees will be planted during the Village's Parkway Tree Planting Program (see below). Privately owned EAB-infested trees will need to be removed by the resident/property owner. Parkway Tree Planting Program

The Village of Wheeling has an ongoing Parkway Tree Planting Program during which trees are planted in locations where dead or hazardous trees were removed. In order to maintain a diverse urban forest, several different species of trees are selected for planting through this program. Parkway tree planting happens twice a year: the spring planting occurs between April and June, and the fall planting occurs between September and November. 
