From the Desk of President Horcher

The Village of Wheeling's 125th summer is now well underway! Anniversary festivities kicked off on June 23 with a parade along Dundee Road followed by a concert in Heritage Park; this year's June 29 Rock 'n' Run the Runway event at Chicago Executive Airport will include entertainment by Wheeling's own Haley Reinhart, along with other local favorites. The celebration continues throughout the summer with an anniversary spin on customary events, including the Chamber of Commerce's golf outing on July 25, the Wheeling Park District's classic car show and old-fashioned sock hop on July 27, and Wheeling Helping Hands' golf outing and pig roast on September 6 and 7. You'll find more information about many of these events elsewhere in this newsletter.

Naturally warmer weather brings opportunities for productivity as well as for recreation and entertainment. The Village's contractors have already made substantial progress on projects including water main replacement on Foster Avenue, street improvements in Kingsport Commons, Chelsea Cove, Tahoe Village, and Lexington Commons, and the construction of a bridge across the Diversionary Channel to enable future development in northeast Wheeling. Village staff is also making preparations for new water and sewer infrastructure near the airport, water main improvements on Dundee Road, and the complete replacement of Fire Station 23 on Wheeling Road, all of which will begin soon.

As always, these public projects support and respond to private development. Later this summer Panattoni Development expects to break ground on a 162,000-square-foot industrial building at Wolf Road and Kerry Lane; the \$13 million project will provide prototype logistics and warehousing space. The existing Gulf station at Elmhurst and Dundee will soon be reconstructed as a 7-Eleven gas station and convenience store. Old Munich Tavern on North Milwaukee has reopened after significant renovations, and Lana's Dazzling Desserts in Riverside Plaza has recently undertaken a major expansion, more than doubling in size. A number of new businesses have opened in recent months, including Coffeessions, Bella's Wine Bistro, May's Lounge, Kiki's Café Monte Carlo, and the Starbucks in Wheeling Town Center.

Substantial progress continues at the Town Center as tenants build out their spaces and the first residents occupy their new homes. The 600 residential units that the Town Center and Northgate Crossing collectively brought to Wheeling will soon be joined by an additional 321 apartments now under construction at the adjacent Uptown 500 development; this \$90 million project will feature an internal "Texas wrap" parking design similar to the Town Center apartments, as well as 12,000 square feet of retail space.

Though long envisioned in the Village's Comprehensive Plan, the transformation of the area around the Metra station is striking to behold—and interesting to consider alongside other major changes throughout our history, changes that have often been linked to transportation. Wheeling originated as a midday stopover for travelers on their way to Wisconsin, and really began to grow once Milwaukee Avenue was paved. The increasing popularity of automobiles led to more road improvements, which led in turn to residential construction as suburban living became practical. The railroad that first served grain mills later eased the transition of many farms into manufacturing facilities. And now a number of factors have led to the rise of transit-oriented developments like those taking shape along the Dundee Road corridor: high-quality, high-density housing that provides commuter, dining, recreational, and entertainment options that can be easily accessed without any need to get behind the wheel.

It's hard to say what the next 125 years will bring, but with the help and guidance of the community, we at the Village will do our best to be prepared. We're grateful as always for the engaged involvement of our residents, and hope to see many of you over the course of this anniversary year. I and the Board of Trustees wish you a safe and enjoyable summer!



Summer Weather Safety

Now that summer has returned, so have thunderstorms and the potential for severe weather in our area. Like any emergency situation, a few minutes of planning and preparation can help to keep you and your family safe.

- Make sure all downspouts and gutters are free of debris and blockage. Install splash blocks and downspout extensions to move the rainwater away from the foundation of your home.
- Make sure your sump pump is in good condition. Install extension hoses or piping to move the rainwater away from the foundation of your home. All sump pumps must be piped to the exterior of your home. Connecting your sump pump to the sanitary sewer system within your home is unsafe, causes surcharging and flooding during major rainstorms, and is illegal.
- Install surge protectors on sensitive electronic appliances such as computers, home theater systems, televisions, stereos, etc.
- Change the batteries in your flashlights and portable radios annually. Keep several flashlights in various locations within your home so that you can readily find one if the power goes out. Consider purchasing a battery-operated camping lantern.
- Make sure your family's emergency plan and supplies are up to date. Plan for a minimum of three days without electricity, natural gas, and water. Keep food supplies on hand that do not require cooking, as well as a manual can opener. Replace bottled water at least every six months in order to ensure freshness and quality. Confirm that your homeowner's insurance is up to date and meets your needs. Keep a copy of your policy in a secure but readily available location.
- When severe weather is forecast, secure all loose items around your home or place them in your garage or shed. Close all window blinds to prevent flying glass should the windows break during the storm.
- As the storm approaches, go inside your home. Do not use the telephone or take a shower or bath. Stay away from all windows, and monitor your television or radio for up-to-date weather information and emergency information. If you are stuck outside during a storm, do not stand under a tree, lean against aluminum siding, or seek cover under a metal deck umbrella.
- If a tornado warning is issued for our area, immediately seek the protection of a basement area or windowless interior room. As the tornado approaches, pull yourself into a seated fetal position and cover your body and head with a blanket or other thick protective covering. After the tornado passes, be aware of potential natural gas leaks, damaged electrical systems, broken glass, and exposed nails. If your home is damaged, get out and stay out until it is confirmed to be structurally safe.
- If a storm sewer is located in front of your home, please keep all landscaping debris off of the grate. Failure to do so can cause heavy rains to not properly drain away, subjecting your home to flooding. Use a lawn rake to pull debris onto the parkway.
- If your electrical power goes out, **DO NOT CALL THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OR POLICE DEPARTMENT!** During severe storms, public safety departments are very busy. Instead call ComEd at 1.800.334.7661 to report your power outage.
- Only use emergency electrical generators in a well-ventilated, dry area. Do not run gasoline-powered generators inside your home, since dangerous levels of carbon monoxide can occur. Do not run extension cords between properties or across streets, since extension cords are not designed to provide large amounts of power over a long distance and may become damaged.
- If your home or basement becomes flooded, exercise extreme caution. Do not walk in standing water since it can be electrically energized. Call the Fire Department if there is any electrical arcing or smell of natural gas in your home. The Village of Wheeling does not pump out basements since it is dangerous and can cause additional damage to the foundation of your home. The best solution is to wait for the floodwaters to recede before proceeding with any clean-up efforts. If you are using a wet/dry vacuum, keep the electrical cord elevated and out of the water. If your water heater and/or furnace is covered with water, turn off the natural gas supply to your home at the outside gas meter. The shut-off is a quarter-turn valve on the gas line coming out of the ground that goes directly to the gas meter.
- After the storm has passed, please help emergency crews by removing downed tree limbs from the street and placing them in the parkway. Always look out for downed power lines and never assume they are de-energized. If power lines are lying across a fence, your home, or an automobile, do not touch these items, since they may be energized. If you find fallen power lines in your yard, contact the Fire Department and ComEd immediately.
- Do not allow children to play in standing stormwater that has accumulated in the streets or roadside ditches. The surcharging of the storm sewer system may have caused manhole covers to become displaced; the water may suddenly be drawn into the storm sewer system and can entrap your child.

Wheeling Wildlife Tips

The Village of Wheeling has an abundance of wildlife, and in most instances people and wildlife can coexist. It is not uncommon for raccoons, skunks, coyotes, rabbits, and waterfowl to travel the neighborhoods at night. It is also not uncommon to encounter wildlife in your yard or while you are out walking through the village. Changes in habitat and the different seasons will cause fluctuations in wildlife population and travel.

Guidelines for wildlife encounters:

- Please do not feed wildlife
- Do not handle orphaned offspring or sick wildlife
- Do not try to approach or corner wildlife
- Secure all trash in garbage cans with the lid closed tightly



Feeding wild animals will cause them to discontinue foraging, making them dependent on human interaction. Further, human food is not appropriate nutrition for wild animals: it can cause them to become sick and sometimes starve to death. Lastly, wildlife may become unafraid of humans, increasing the risk of inappropriate human and wildlife contact.

Remedies for wildlife control:

- Grubs: Removing this food source should deter the presence of feeding wildlife. Try Murphy's Oil or dish detergent mixed with water in a spray bottle. Spray over grub-infested areas.
- Ground burrows: Ammonia-soaked rags work well to vacate an unwanted visitor. Soak the rags and toss them in the burrow. Once the animal has vacated, pound rebar into the ground by the entrance and fill in the hole to prevent rehabilitation.
- Raccoons in attics: Keeping a light on and a radio running for days will often do the trick to vacate unwanted wildlife in the attic. Repairs to openings must be made to discourage new infestations.
- Animals in yard: The Scarecrow is an automatic sensory sprinkler that attaches to a regular garden hose. It detects movement and sends out a blast of water, scaring away all wildlife, including feral cats.

In Cook County, the law states that if you feed feral cats, you are required to trap, neuter, and return (TNR) them. For more information on TNR, please contact Community Development at 847.459.2620.

Northwest Mosquito Abatement District (NWMAD)


The NWMAD is a separate agency from the Village of Wheeling that is specifically responsible for mosquito abatement. They cover approximately 242 square miles of Cook County, including Wheeling, and apply larvicide and adulticide as needed. Residents with questions or concerns may contact the NWMAD at 847.537.2306, or visit www.nwmadil.com. The Village of Wheeling does not provide mosquito control services.

Summer Watering Restrictions

The Village's even-odd address watering restriction is in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited from 12–6 p.m. every day.

The watering of newly-laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit, and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks. Contact the Department of Community Development with any questions about water restrictions at 847.459.2620.

Waste Management *At Your Door* Special Waste Collections

The Village recently approved a five-year agreement with Waste Management (WM) for the collection of refuse, recycling, and yard waste for residents, and of refuse and recycling for commercial establishments. Effective June 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020, non-senior single-family home rates will be \$22.23 per month and senior single-family home rates will be \$17.79 per month. To be eligible for the senior rate, please visit the Village's website at www.wheelingil.gov/431/Senior-Discount for requirements or contact 847.279.6900 for information.

The contract also includes a new program for curbside residents called *At Your Door* (AYD) Special Collection that is included in the monthly rates. The AYD program provides residents with an easy and convenient option to properly recycle household electronics and dispose of hazardous chemicals. The cost for the program is included in your monthly rate, and residents can utilize the program as many times during the year as necessary.

What materials are collected through the AYD Special Collection program?

Acceptable materials include, but may not be limited to, automotive products (antifreeze, batteries, brake fluid, motor oil & filters); garden chemicals (fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, weed killers); paint products (paint, caulk, glue, stain, thinner, wood preservative); household cleaners (ammonia, cleaning products, rust remover, tile/shower and upholstery cleaners); items containing mercury (batteries, fluorescent lamp tubes, thermometers and thermostats); sharps (only if placed in sealed, rigid, puncture-resistant containers); and electronics (computers, monitors, keyboards, televisions, DVD/CD/VCR players, cell phones, printers, microwaves).

Ammunition, explosives, asbestos, tires, or any unlabeled or leaking materials will not be collected.

How do I schedule an AYD collection?

Call 1.800.449.7587, M-F from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; or visit www.wmatyourdoor.com and submit a request form.

Please have the list of unwanted materials ready for their information.

What happens when I schedule a collection?

A collection kit will be sent via mail. The kit consists of a plastic bag, a bag tie, a survey card, labels, and an instruction sheet. Follow the directions for appropriate packaging and collection. If the materials for collection are not labeled, are leaking, or for some reason are not acceptable, a door hanger will be left with further instructions. When the package is ready for collection, place the package outdoors near the side door or by the garage on the specific designated collection date provided by WM. You do not need to be present during collections. Do not place the package near the curb or street.

Refuse Collection Guidelines

Keep our community attractive and maintain healthy living conditions by following these curbside collection guidelines.

- Place all waste at the curb no earlier than 5 p.m. the evening before and no later than 6 a.m. the day of a scheduled collection.
- Place all refuse, recycling, and yard waste inside designated carts with the lids closed for scheduled collections. A bulk waste item that does not fit in the designated garbage cart is the only exception.
- Remove all empty carts and items not collected by 8 a.m. the day after scheduled collections.
- On all other days, keep carts and bulk waste items in the garage or adjacent to a principal structure within the side or rear yard of any lot. No waste or containers can be stored in front of a principal structure or within the front yard area of any property.

Yard Waste Collections

Yard waste collections continue through November 30 on regularly scheduled pick-up days. Please follow these guidelines:

- Place grass clippings, leaves, and short branches in containers clearly marked with a red "X" or in biodegradable two-ply paper bags. Bags and containers must not be larger than 32 gallons or heavier than 50 pounds. There is no limit to the number of bags or containers.
- Waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- Organics such as fruits, vegetables, coffee grounds, etc. and dirt, stone, concrete, and rock are not accepted.
- Multi-family units do not have yard waste services.
- Brush and tree branches must be collected and tied with biodegradable string in distinct bundles that are a maximum of four feet in length, two feet in diameter, and weigh no more than 50 lbs each, with no individual branch greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of branch bundles provided for pick-up.






