

Wheeling Board of Health Activities for 2013

This year, blood drives will be held March 13, July 10, and November 13. Please come in and donate. Each pint of blood saves three lives! Thank you to all the residents who donated during 2012!

Mark your calendars for the Community Health Fair & Open House on Saturday, October 19, 2013. The 2012 fair was very successful and we look forward to providing additional health services to residents in 2013.

The Prescription Medication Collection will continue to be held on the third Saturday of every month from 10 a.m. until 12 noon in front of the Police Station located at 1 Community Blvd. We accept the following:

- Prescription and over-the-counter medications in their original containers. No liquid medications will be accepted. We cannot accept any controlled substances such as Oxycontin and Percocet.
- Sharps (needles & syringes) in rigid containers with a sealed lid. Sharps containers will be handed out at the collection and are available at the Village Hall.
- Household batteries (AA, AAA, C, D, 9V) and rechargeable batteries (Lithium NiMh, NiCad). No automotive batteries will be accepted. Each rechargeable battery must have masking tape on contact points or be contained in an individual self-locking plastic bag.
- Eyeglasses including sunglasses and telescopic, magnifying, and prescription eyewear. Children's glasses are especially needed. The glasses will be given to the Lions Club "Recycle for Sight" program.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & PUBLIC WORKS

Snow Season Procedures

The Public Works Department is responsible for plowing and de-icing arterial roads and residential streets, as well as public sidewalks, bus stop shelters, the Metra station, and Village-owned buildings. Public Works is not responsible for county or state roadways. County roads include Lake Cook Road, Buffalo Grove Road, Schoenbeck Road, Hintz Road, and Aptakisic Road (call 847.827.1164). State roads include Elmhurst Road (Route 83), Dundee Road, Milwaukee Avenue, Palatine Road, McHenry Road, and Wolf Road (Manchester north to Milwaukee Avenue and Marquardt south to Camp McDonald Road) (call 847.705.4222).

Residents are advised of the following during the snow season:

- For safety, please maintain a safe distance of 100 feet or more when driving behind a snow plow or salt truck.
- Please shovel snow away from fire hydrants so that they can be accessible in case of emergencies.
- Please do not place refuse or recycling containers in the street.

Parking Restrictions

•Do not park vehicles on any street in the Village within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more (per Village Code 9.10.103). This allows streets to be plowed accordingly by Public Works. Vehicles in violation will be towed.

Sidewalk Requirements

- Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property whenever there is a snowfall and by 10 a.m. on every morning thereafter. If the snow and ice are frozen, owners are responsible for spreading the areas with sand, sawdust, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice (Village Code 11.16.010).
- Snow or ice shall not be deposited into any street, road, or highway, or along the shoulder or edge of any street, road, or highway (Village Code 11.16.040). Please deposit snow and ice from sidewalks and driveways onto the parkway.
- Residents and property owners who are in violation may be penalized.

Residents may contact the Public Works Department at 847.279.6900 with any questions or concerns.

Protect Pipes from Freezing

Water expands as it freezes, placing great pressure on anything that contains it. Expanding water can cause pipes found in basements, crawlspaces, attics, garages, and kitchen cabinets to rupture. Pipes against exterior walls with little or no insulation are also vulnerable to freezing.


Residents can take measures to prevent water lines from freezing and water pipes from rupturing in homes during extreme cold conditions.

- If going away, keep home temperatures at least 55 degrees F.
- Disconnect and drain outdoor hoses.
- Allow cold water to drip through faucets to prevent pipes from freezing since the water temperature is above freezing.
- Open cabinets and closets containing water lines to allow warm air to circulate around plumbing.
- Consider installing pipe insulation.
- Check pipe insulation periodically to make sure it is dry.
- Seal cracks in doors, windows and foundations.
- Know where your master valve (also known as the main water cut-off valve) is located in case you need to shut off the water.

If you know that a property has been unoccupied for several days, notify Public Works at 847.279.6900. This can prevent costly damage to the unoccupied property.

Snow Shoveling Guidelines

When shoveling the end of the driveway near the street, place the snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street). If it is piled on the other side, it is more likely to be pushed into the driveway apron when the streets are being plowed. Also, clear a few feet of the edge of the street and curb to the left of the driveway (as you face the street). This creates a pocket for the snow to spill into and will help reduce the amount of snow at the end of the driveway. Refer to the illustration below.



Holiday Refuse Reminders

Holiday Tree Recycling

Non-artificial holiday trees are collected at residential curbsides during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. All decorations, stands, etc. must be removed from trees. Please do not place trees in plastic bags.



Holiday Lights Recycling

Through the Holiday Lights Recycling Program, sponsored by the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) and Elgin Recycling, residents can recycle holiday mini-lights, C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, and extension cords of all colors and lengths at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Garland, live greens, wreaths and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. Residents may contact 847.279.6900 with any questions. The program concludes February 28, 2013.

Collection services will be delayed by one day if the holiday is on a weekday.

Electronics Recycling

The State of Illinois prohibited the disposal of electronics in landfills beginning January 1, 2012. Because of this ban, waste haulers are not allowed to collect and dispose of electronics as waste. Items must be collected and recycled by a registered collector.

However, residents may bring certain approved electronics to permanent locations listed below. Contact the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) at 847.724.9205 or visit their website at www.swancc.org for more information.

Acceptable electronics include only: cable receivers, computers (including tablets), digital converter boxes, digital video disc players, digital video disc recorders, electronic mice, electronic keyboards, facsimile machines, monitors, portable digital music players, printers, satellite receivers, scanners, small scale servers, televisions, video game consoles, and videocassette recorders.

You may also drop off electronics at electronic retail stores. Some electronic retail stores may charge a small fee for larger items. Another recycling or reuse option includes donating electronics in good, working condition to charitable organizations.

Sidewalk Removal & Replacement Program

The 2013 Sidewalk Removal and Replacement Program will begin in late spring/early summer. Village of Wheeling Staff continue to compile a list of locations which qualify for this work. If you have a public sidewalk that is in need of repair, please contact the Capital Projects & Design Division at 847.279.6900 and provide us with an address and phone number. Staff will evaluate the sidewalk to see if it qualifies for replacement as funding becomes available.

Update on the Water Meter Upgrade Project

This project consists of upgrading all residential, commercial, and industrial water meters throughout the entire Village. In order to demonstrate a fully operational and automated conversion from the old system to the new system, several "pilot areas" were selected for removal and replacement of water meters and transmitters before the full implementation of the project. Implementation and evaluation of the "pilot areas" is nearing completion. This equipment upgrade is being done at no cost to the customer. Full implementation of this upgrade project is expected to begin in mid-December or early January.

Special Needs Resident List

The Village of Wheeling Special Needs Resident Notification (Illinois Premise Alert Program Public Act 96-0788) is now available. The Illinois Premise Alert allows people with special needs to provide information to police, fire, and EMS personnel to be kept in a database. This information will be provided to responders dealing with situations involving the special needs individuals.

To let emergency personnel know about your or your family members' special needs, pick up a form at the Police Department or Pavilion Senior Center. Forms may be completed onsite, or you may send them to the Wheeling Police Department Communications Supervisor at 1 Community Boulevard, Wheeling, IL. Your information will not be shared with anyone outside of the emergency personnel of the Village of Wheeling and any other agency needed to provide emergency response. The information provided on the list will not result in preferential treatment or change the response of trained emergency personnel. Inclusion on the list will result in emergency responders being better prepared to assist individual residents with special needs.

Access to Care

The Village of Wheeling Human Services Department is now a registration site for Access to Care. Access to Care® is a model primary healthcare program serving low-income, uninsured individuals in suburban Cook County, Illinois and in northwest Chicago (west of Pulaski Road AND north of North Avenue).

The Access to Care program is a unique public/private partnership making primary healthcare and ancillary pharmacy, laboratory and radiology services available to those individuals caught in the gap between eligibility for public health insurance programs (All Kids, FamilyCare, Medicaid, Medicare) and having private insurance. The program provides affordable diagnosis and treatment to individuals and families for a small co-payment per visit, procedure, or prescription medication.

Eligibility screening is determined by the following criteria: family incomes below 200% of the federal poverty level, with no health insurance (or a deductible of \$500 or more per person); ineligibility for All Kids, FamilyCare, Medicaid, or Medicare; and residence in suburban Cook County or Northwest Chicago.

The Wheeling Food Pantry

The Wheeling Food Pantry is an initiative of the Wheeling Rotary Club and is supported by several community organizations, including the Village of Wheeling, OMNI Youth Services, St. Joseph the Worker Church, Wheeling High School, and Wheeling Elementary School District 21. Social Services staff from the Village of Wheeling Human Services Department as well as from OMNI Youth Services are available during pantry hours to provide visitors with additional services as needed.

Requirements for utilizing the Food Pantry: Patrons must be either Wheeling residents or have children who attend School District 21 or Wheeling High School. Patrons must bring proof of residency (driver's license or other official identification, utility bill, lease, mortgage, or a letter from School District 21 or Wheeling High School). Qualifying patrons may utilize the Food Pantry once every 30 days.

Non-perishable food donations of the following variety are badly needed: peanut butter and jelly, pasta sauce and pasta noodles, canned meats (tuna, chicken, ham, spam, salmon), cold cereal, oatmeal, Cream of Wheat, pancake mix and syrup, SpaghettiOs, ravioli, rice (minute and dried), beans (pinto, garbanzo, lentil, black, red, in dried or canned form), cooking oil, beef stew, instant potatoes, canned vegetables (potatoes, corn, peas), Stovetop stuffing mix, canned pumpkin, cake mixes, cookie mixes, Jell-O, pudding, and muffin mixes.

Collection bins for these donations may be found at Wheeling Village Hall, the Wheeling Police Department, the Wheeling Pavilion Senior Center, and Wheeling Fire Station 24. Donations may also be brought directly to the pantry during regular business hours.

Does Your Vehicle Have Daytime Running Lamps?

A Daytime Running Lamp (DRL, Daylight Running Lamp or Daytime Running Light) is an automotive lighting device which is installed in pairs on the front of a roadway motor vehicle. The lamps automatically switch on to emit white, yellow, or amber light when the vehicle is moving forward in order to increase the prominence of the vehicle during daylight hours.



Daytime running lamps began appearing on vehicles in the U.S. in 1991, and today most vehicles have them. Unfortunately these lights cause confusion for many drivers because they come on automatically. When drivers start their vehicles at night, they see the lights and assume that all of their lights are on, but daytime running lamps do not turn on the tail lights. With the time change and the shorter daylight hours, the Police Department is seeing an increase in vehicles on the roadway without illuminated tail lights. Driving with no tail lights at night is a safety hazard and causes an increase in rear-end accidents. Driving with no tail lights is a causative factor in an accident, and you could be found at fault for the accident.

The Wheeling Police Department would like to remind you to take a few minutes to become familiar with your vehicle lighting system and how it works. It will keep you safe when driving. The safety of the motoring public in the Village of Wheeling is a top priority of the Wheeling Police Department, and your help is greatly appreciated. Winter Safety Tips

Freezing temperatures, blowing snow, and slippery roads are all part of the winter season. While most people do not look forward to these seasonal problems, a few simple steps can prevent the winter season from becoming a tragic one for you and your family.

- Give your home a holiday gift – a new battery for the smoke detector. If your smoke detector is more than ten years old (or you don't know how old it is), it is time to replace it with a new one. A properly functioning smoke detector increases your chances of surviving a fire in your home by 50%.

- When removing snow from your driveway and sidewalks, remember to pace yourself. Even though it is cold outside, removal of snow can be a physically demanding activity. Make sure you are well hydrated by drinking a glass of water prior to starting and again when you are done. The wetter the snow, the heavier it is, which makes removing it more physically demanding and more stressful on your heart.

- Keep children away when using a snow blower. The snow blower may pick up a rock, a piece of chipped concrete, or even a piece of ice, which can become a dangerous missile. These items can be expelled from the snow blower with such force that they can seriously injure persons nearby.



- Keep loose clothing away from the moving parts on a snow blower. Loose clothing, particularly scarves and gloves, can be drawn into the spinning augur and cause personal entrapment in the machine or the amputation of fingers.

- Never refuel a snow blower while it is running or inside your garage. Let the engine cool for several minutes before refueling. Spilled fuel on a hot engine can ignite and cause a fire.

- If you live near a fire hydrant, please make sure to remove the snow surrounding it. It is important for the Fire Department to have a minimum of two feet cleared around all sides of a hydrant. Failure to remove this snow may result in a delay in extinguishing a fire in your home or that of a neighbor due to a lack of available water supply and the need to find another non-obscured fire hydrant.

- Winter weather conditions can cause additional traffic congestion, which makes it even more difficult for fire and police personnel to respond to emergency calls. Please do your part by pulling all the way over to the right side of the road when you see or hear emergency vehicles coming.

Busan Jung Pavilion Grand Opening
