

## From the Desk of President Horcher

I'm honored to provide my first greeting to the residents of Wheeling as your new Village President. I'd like to take this opportunity to extend thanks to everyone who voted in the April 4 election, regardless of how you voted. The Village depends on the involvement of its citizens, and appreciates all those who took the time to get informed and made the effort to let their voices be heard. I look forward to being Wheeling's lead public servant for the next four years.

I'm happy to report progress on several notable projects now underway throughout town. Storm sewer and water main installation is nearly complete at the Wheeling Town Center site between the Community Campus and the Metra Station, and we expect construction of the residential building and parking structure to begin soon. The developers are in the process of recruiting a mix of restaurants and other retailers that will maximize the long-term viability of the project, and are making good progress in their negotiations with a number of exciting prospective tenants.

On the north side of the Dundee Road corridor, exterior construction on the Northgate Crossing townhomes is nearly complete; sidewalks have been installed, and landscaping will follow shortly. These townhomes follow the developer's successful earlier project, the apartments and townhomes on the opposite side of Northgate Parkway, which are already 85% leased.

In news from Wheeling's industrial sector, site work is now underway on a new 181,000-square-foot industrial building at 720 Northgate Parkway, just south of Lake Cook Road. On June 5 developer Hamilton Partners and their general contractor Morgan / Harbour Construction held a groundbreaking ceremony attended by Village officials, including myself, and staff. This project, the first speculative industrial building to be built in Wheeling in more than twenty years, is scheduled to be complete by the fall.

A significant addition to Wheeling's community of retailers came with the recent opening of Binny's Beverage Depot in the Schwind Crossing shopping center on Lake Cook Road. Binny's has launched its Wheeling location with several Friday tasting events.

Finally, the Village was honored to be visited last month by a delegation from Busan, South Korea, led by the city's mayor, Suh Byung-Soo. The delegation visited Village Hall for a ceremony in which Capitol Drive was designated as Honorary Busan Drive, and afterward joined Village officials and staff at the Korean Cultural Center of Chicago for a dedication of traditional garden walls donated by the City of Busan. Busan is a city of 3.5 million people on the southeast coast of the Korean Peninsula.

I look forward to sharing more good news in the months ahead. I hope everyone enjoys our Rock 'n' Run the Runway event on July 1; best wishes for a safe and enjoyable summer!

# POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS

## Paramedic Services: When to Call

Each year, the Wheeling Fire Department responds to nearly 5,000 emergency calls, of which almost 3,000 are for emergency medical situations. While most of these calls are for legitimate medical emergencies, unfortunately there are also many calls for non-emergency situations. These non-emergency calls include colds, muscle strains, minor lacerations that can be treated at home, or situations that can be easily handled by a routine physician's office visit. Unnecessary usage of emergency medical services increases operating costs by tens of thousands of dollars annually, which is eventually passed on to the community through higher taxes and service fees. In addition, these unnecessary calls result in possible delays of service to those individuals who truly need prompt medical attention, as well as backups and overloads at local area emergency rooms, and can end up costing individuals hundreds of dollars that may not be covered by their personal health insurance or Medicare/Medicaid. Depending upon the medical services provided, Wheeling charges an ambulance transport fee between \$372 and \$640 + mileage per emergency call. The following guidelines will help you to make a wise decision regarding the use of the Village's emergency medical services.

**•Paramedic service should be requested for:** difficulty breathing, chest pains, apparent stroke conditions, loss of consciousness, obvious fractures to long bones (arms and/or legs) or skull, trauma resulting from entrapment, amputations, extensive bleeding, penetrating injuries of the central body core (abdomen, chest, neck, or head), fevers in excess of 101 degrees F for an extended period of time, seizures, 2nd and 3rd degree burns, overdoses, ingestion or inhalation of known toxic substances, and any other obvious life-threatening medical conditions.

**•Paramedic service should not be requested for:** non-life threatening injuries or illnesses, such as scrapes, bruises, abrasions, broken fingers or toes, black eyes, minor punctures to the hands or feet, splinters, indigestion, stiff or sore backs, sore shoulders, general body aches, sunburn, minor skin irritations, diaper rash, children with colds, colicky babies, adults with minor flu or cold symptoms that have lasted for several days, or any other minor medical conditions that can be safely treated by your personal physician or regional health clinic, or if you can be safely transported to an emergency room by a private vehicle.

Paramedic services are strictly intended for true medical emergencies and not as routine medical care or as a replacement for professional in-home care assistance programs. By making wise and appropriate use of emergency medical services, you are helping ensure these services remain cost-effective and available for everyone who really needs them. In addition, you are also helping to control your own personal health care expenses, while reducing the likelihood of regional emergency room overload. But when in doubt, always call 9-1-1 first.





# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & PUBLIC WORKS

## Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), also called the annual water report, is a document that provides consumer information about the source and quality of local drinking water. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Consumer Confidence Report Rule, every community water supplier must provide an annual report by July 1 of each year for the previous year's information. The CCR summarizes chemical and bacteriological contaminants, regulation compliances, educational health information, and water system contact information.

## Storm Sewer & Inlets

A storm sewer is a system designed to carry water runoff and other drainage. The untreated runoff is carried in underground pipes or open ditches and discharged into nearby streams, lakes, rivers, or ponds. Inlets to this system can be found in curbs, curb lines, or other low-lying outdoor areas.

Runoff that is polluted affects our waterways and ecosystems. Sources of pollution collected in runoff include motor oil, antifreeze/transmission fluid, paint, solvents/degreasers, cooking grease, detergents, pet waste, yard waste, excessive dirt and gravel, trash, construction debris, pesticides and fertilizers, and home improvement waste. Property owners can prevent runoff pollution from entering water sources by disposing of used chemicals and automotive fluids at designated facilities, using pesticides and fertilizers sparingly or using organic mulch and safer pest controls, composting or mulching yard waste, sweeping litter/debris and construction debris from properties, and cleaning up after pets.

Additionally, storm sewer inlets should be clear of leaves, grass clippings, sticks, rocks, and trash. Such material can clog storm sewers and inlets, creating flood conditions during a rain. Take notice of the inlets near your property and clear any debris which could prevent the free flow of water by using a rake and disposing of the debris appropriately. It is unlawful to dump any debris—including leaves, sticks, and grass clippings—on to Village streets.

## Caring for Newly Planted Parkway Trees

If your address has received a new parkway tree, the Village is requesting your assistance in promoting its health and growth.



Watering is the key to a new tree's survival. Too much water will drown a tree and too little water will dry it out. During a normal season, a tree should receive one inch of water per week. Watering should only be performed during the months of May through September, and only if sufficient rainfall does not occur. It is important to keep the new tree watered for the first year after planting.

A Treegator bag, which is a slow release watering bag, has been wrapped around the parkway tree to assist residents in the watering process. These bags hold approximately 15 gallons of water and release the water through small holes that slowly drain the bag within five to nine hours. Residents are asked to please fill the Treegator bag with water once a week throughout the summer. Public Works staff will remove the bag from the tree during the month of September.

## Household Hazardous / Chemical Waste

Numerous household items such as cleaners, lawn or garden care products, auto parts, and fertilizer/pesticides can contain hazardous ingredients that are harmful to human health and the environment, and require proper and safe disposal. It is highly recommended, whenever possible, to purchase limited quantities of these types of household items so that the amount of potentially hazardous waste produced is limited.

Permanent drop-off facilities are available to Illinois residents for household hazardous waste disposal at no charge. These facilities are located in Naperville, Rockford, Chicago, and Gurnee.



## Watering Restrictions

To further water conservation efforts, the Village of Wheeling has implemented an even-odd address watering restriction in effect from May 15 through September 15.

- Residents with street addresses that end with an even number (0, 2, 4, 6, and 8) can only water on even-numbered calendar days.
- Residents with street addresses that end with an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7, and 9) can only water on odd-numbered calendar days.
- Watering is prohibited for all properties from 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. every day.

The watering of newly laid sod is permitted at any time and on any day upon the issuance of an appropriate permit and for a time not to exceed two consecutive weeks.




