From the Desk of President Horcher

As colder weather arrives and brings an end to this year's construction season, I'm happy to report significant progress on several notable projects currently underway in Wheeling. Since it officially broke ground in July, we've seen substantial construction at Wheeling Town Center, the transit-oriented mixed-use development that will bring 300 apartments and 100,000 square feet of retail and restaurants to the area between the Community Campus and the Metra station. We recently learned that in addition to the CMX Theater anchoring the retail portion of the development, the Town Center will also include City Works Eatery & Pour House, a 10,000-square-foot restaurant on the pedestrian plaza.

The Town Center isn't the only project taking shape along the Dundee corridor. Construction has moved forward at the Whitley of Wheeling, the 102-unit assisted living and memory care facility on the north side of the road; the Whitley is scheduled to open in late 2018 or early 2019, helping to fulfill a growing need for senior housing in the region. And the Village continues discussions with the developer of Uptown 500, a proposed transit-oriented mixed-use development at the northwest corner of Dundee and Northgate Parkway; we expect to have additional updates on this project in the coming months.

On the east side of Wheeling, Boston Fish Market continues its major renovations to the former Pete Miller's restaurant on Milwaukee Avenue, and plans to open early next year. Additionally, developer DR Horton has been approved to construct 39 townhomes on the Deerfield Moving & Storage site on Wolf Road, and plans to break ground in early 2019.

In a sign of continued confidence in the industrial sector, construction is in progress on two speculative developments, the first to be built in Wheeling in two decades. The first, a 181,000-square-foot facility on Northgate Parkway, is well underway, while the second, an 84,000-square-foot facility at the former ABF site on Chaddick Drive, recently broke ground; both are designed to suit a variety of warehouse, distribution, logistics, and manufacturing uses. Wheeling has the fifth-largest manufacturing employment concentration in Illinois, with over 14 million square feet of industrial space and a vacancy rate under six percent. This new construction seeks to meet that demand.

Planning for a prosperous future means making investments in people as well as facilities, and the Village continues to play a connecting role between industry, educators, and other local stakeholders to foster the development of Wheeling's workforce. The Village recently joined the Korean Cultural Center and Wheeling High School in welcoming a delegation from Suncheon, South Korea, in an effort to find opportunities for mutually-beneficial exchanges in the field of education. The delegation's visit coincided with the Wheeling / Prospect Heights Area Chamber of Commerce & Industry's annual Taste of the Town event, which provided our guests with an opportunity to sample various treats from Restaurant Row and beyond.



President Horcher received a gift from the City of Suncheon, South Korea during their delegation visit to Wheeling on September 28, 2017. Suncheon Deputy Mayor Young-jai Jun presented the gift to President Horcher.

We'll have many more festivities to look forward to over the next couple of months, and I particularly encourage you to join us for the Village's own Lights Around Wheeling event, scheduled to take place at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, November 19 in Friendship Park. As always, the event will feature snacks, entertainment, a visit from Santa, and the lighting of the Village's holiday lights. I and the Board of Trustees hope to see you there! We and the Village staff wish you and your family a safe and happy holiday season!

***IF THERE IS A WINTER ADVISORY ON THE DAY OF A MEDICATION/SHARPS COLLECTION, THE DROP-OFF WILL BE CANCELLED AND NOT RESCHEDULED.** No one will be available to accept the medications or sharps; do not leave items at the Police Department.

Screenings also are appropriate for anyone who does not have a concern right now, but who wants to establish a baseline score for comparison in the future.

Winter & Holiday Safety Tips

With the arrival of winter and the holiday season comes the arrival of snow and ice, too. With some planning and advanced preparation, you can make this a safe and fun-filled season.

- **Have your home furnace or boiler professionally serviced and cleaned.** A service technician can verify that dangerous carbon monoxide (CO) gas is not backing up into your home.
- **Test and vacuum your home smoke detectors and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors.** Dust and dirt accumulated on the unit can delay its activation when needed. If you have not recently changed your detector's battery, do so. Also, if your smoke detectors are ten or more years old or your CO detectors are more than five years old, completely replace them.
- **Prepare your vehicle before the first winter storm occurs.** Check your car's tire inflation pressure since tires lose pressure during the fall due to outside temperature fluctuations. Also check the remaining tire tread and consider replacing your tires if they are old or worn. Keep your fuel tank above half-full at all times to minimize the collection of moisture in your fuel tank and reduce the risk of your fuel line freezing up. If your vehicle's battery is old, now is a great time to have it replaced as car batteries are greatly affected by cold temperatures.
- **Place a winter emergency kit inside of each family vehicle.** This kit should include a blanket, collapsible snow shovel, ice scraper, jumper cables, flashlight (with new batteries), road flares, basic first aid kit, cellphone charger, and basic non-perishable food or snacks (ex. granola bars, Pop Tart®, etc.).
- **Use holiday candles with great care.** Always place candles in a sturdy, non-combustible holder, and never leave them burning unattended. Keep lighters and matches properly stored and out of the reach of children when not in use.
- **Inspect holiday lights before installing them.** Check for damaged wires or missing bulbs. Also, do not exceed the manufacturer's recommendations for how many strings of holiday lights can be strung together, usually no more than three or four in a row.
- **Avoid using space heaters if at all possible.** Do not use kerosene or propane heaters indoors since they produce CO gas. Keep all space heaters away from combustible materials, and only use space heaters when the room is occupied. Finally, do not plug them into power strips or electrical multi-adapters.
- **Dispose of leftover gasoline from your lawnmower or snow blower by carefully pouring it into your vehicle's fuel tank.** This is safe to do even if your gasoline is mixed with two-cycle oil. Never pour old gasoline into the sewer system.
- **Dispose of holiday wrappings and trees appropriately.** Never throw these items into a fireplace or wood-burning stove since they burn too fast, generate too much smoke, and may overload the capacity of the fireplace or wood-burning stove.
- **Dispose of fireplace or wood-burning stove ashes appropriately.** Remember, ashes that appear to be "cold" can actually still be a fire risk more than 24 hours later. Do not place them in garbage cans in your home or garage, in case they re-ignite.
- **Do not call 9-1-1 if the electrical power goes out.** Instead, call ComEd at 1-800-EDISON1.

Equifax Breach

News of the Equifax Breach was reported in the media recently. This is a very serious breach, and there is no doubt that Wheeling residents may be affected by this. Please carefully investigate this link from the Federal Trade Commission as it provides a lot of good information: www.consumer.ftc.gov/blog/2017/09/equifax-data-breach-what-do.

The Wheeling Police Department advises that at the very least you:

- **Obtain a security freeze for you and the adult members of your family.** A security freeze will prevent anyone from establishing any new credit in your name. In fact, no one will even be able to check your credit without your authorization. These freezes have to be established with all three credit reporting agencies. - **Monitor your credit card statements monthly (or more frequently if possible).** Even if you have a security freeze, your credit card accounts are not safe from criminals. As stated above, you will need to closely monitor your statement activity for fraud.



Snow Season Procedures

Public Works personnel are preparing for snow control with salt deliveries, vehicle preparation, and year-round training. Snow and ice responsibilities include de-icing and clearing arterial, collector, and residential roadways, certain sections of public sidewalks, bus stops, the train station, and Village-owned buildings and properties.


Public Works is not responsible for the maintenance or snow control on county- or state-owned roadways or rights-of-way. These roadways include:

Driveway Snow Shoveling Recommendations

When shoveling snow at the end of a driveway, place the snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street) to avoid the snow being pushed back onto the driveway by a snowplow truck. Also, clear a few feet at the edge of the street and curb to the left of the driveway (as you face the street). This will help reduce the amount of snow at the end of the driveway. Refer to the illustration above.

Residents are advised of the following safety tips during the snow season:

- Stay 100 feet or more behind a snowplow or salt truck.
- Shovel snow away from fire hydrants near your property for emergency access.
- Do not place refuse, refuse containers, or any other items in the street.

Vehicle Parking Restrictions

- Do not park on any Village street within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more to allow safe and efficient snow and ice control by Public Works.
- Vehicles in violation of this restriction may be towed by the Police Department.

Sidewalk Requirements

- Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property by 10 a.m. the day after a snowfall. Property owners are permitted to spread sand, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice on sidewalks.
- Residents and property owners shall not deposit snow or ice onto any roadway within the Village; instead, deposit snow and ice onto the parkway.

Guidelines for Leaf Disposal

Village Code 11.08.100 prohibits the deposit of leaves into streets, roads, or highways, and along the shoulder, curb, or edge of any street, road, or highway.

-  Leaves intentionally raked into such areas can result in clogged storm sewer drains and subsequent flooding.
-  The Village's contract with Waste Management provides an alternate, convenient method to dispose of leaves and other forms of yard waste for single-family residents.
-  In addition to two-ply Kraft biodegradable paper yard waste bags, residents may use rigid 32-gallon containers clearly marked with a red "X" around the container.
-  Containers and biodegradable bags, when filled, may not exceed 45 pounds in weight. There is no limit to the number of yard waste bags or containers allowed.
-  Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
-  Brush must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string. Bundles must not weigh over 45 lbs., exceed four feet in length or two feet in diameter, or contain limbs greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of brush bundles allowed.
-  Loose or larger brush or logs will not be collected by Waste Management.
-  Yard waste collections conclude on November 30, 2017.

Holiday Tree Collections

Non-artificial holiday trees are collected at residential curbsides by Waste Management during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. Trees that have decorations or are in stands or plastic bags will not be collected.

Holiday Lights Recycling Program

Residents may recycle holiday lights—including mini, C7, C9, rope, and LED lights as well as extension cords of all colors and lengths—at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, November 1, 2017 to February 2, 2018, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Garland, live greens, wreaths, and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. Contact 847.279.6900 with any questions.

Protect Water Lines from Freezing

Follow these measures to protect water lines from freezing and prevent water pipes from rupturing during extreme cold:

- **Monitor water meters:** Wrap water meters with foam insulation or heat tape if located in unheated or colder areas such as crawlspaces. Periodically check your meter and associated piping for cracks or leaks and ensure proper marking and operation of the shut-off valve in case a pipe bursts.
- **Eliminate drafts:** All crawlspace and basement vents, windows, and doors should be repaired and closed, making sure a tight seal exists to keep out cold air.
- **Insulate pipes:** Insulating pipes in colder or unheated areas such as the crawlspace, or pipes located adjacent to an outside wall, helps to reduce the possibility of ruptured pipes. Allow warm air to circulate around pipes accessible by cabinets and located against outside walls.
- **Leave faucets running:** Keeping a continuous trickle of cold water running can help reduce the possibility of a pipe bursting due to freezing.

If you know that a property has been unoccupied for several days, contact the Public Works Utility Division at 847.279.6900 so they can verify if water services are shut off at the property. This can prevent costly damage to the unoccupied property.
