

## From the Desk of President Horcher

As the weather grows colder and the final days of 2018 approach, I'm able to report significant progress on several notable projects in both the private and public sectors.

Over the summer my fellow elected officials and I were honored to join Village staff at a groundbreaking event for a major expansion of the Wieland Thermal Solutions facility on Northgate Parkway. A German-based manufacturer of copper and copper-alloy products, Wieland employs 7,000 people at 65 locations worldwide; its \$25 million expansion will add 110,000 square feet to the existing 220,000-square-foot facility, and is expected to create 65 new jobs. The Village supported this project with a Cook County Class 6b tax incentive. Construction is scheduled for completion in May, with the facility fully operational in October. Wieland considered locations in Wisconsin and North Carolina before deciding to expand in Wheeling, and has cited our region's skilled labor force as a major factor in its decision. The Village has long worked cooperatively with local educators and manufacturers on workforce development, and it was very satisfying to hear Wieland's executives talk about how the "Made in America" label is increasingly valued around the world.

The summer also saw significant headway on the construction of Wheeling Town Center, with substantial work done on the buildings that will house Starbucks, Inland Bank, CMX Cinema, the Learning Experience, Mia's Cantina, and City Works Eatery & Pour House, as well as the residential building. Also signed on to the project are 12 Nails & Spa, Meat and Potatoes Restaurant, and Eggsperience. The developer's leasing representatives have begun taking reservations for apartments, which are scheduled to be ready for occupancy early next year; more information is available at [www.thewheelingtowncenter.com](http://www.thewheelingtowncenter.com). Construction of another major residential development—Wolf Crossing, the 39-unit townhome project at 415 North Wolf Road—is expected to be substantially complete by the end of the year.

The Village, too, had a successful season for its own construction projects, making roadway improvements in several residential and industrial areas. We also made progress on stormwater mitigation—extending a storm sewer under Dundee Road and beginning additional sewer improvements to reduce flooding on south Wheeling Road—and finished the extension of streetlights across the full length of Dundee Road in Wheeling. We'll have more information in upcoming newsletters about further infrastructure improvements to benefit our residents.

The end of the year is, of course, a time for celebration, and I encourage you to join us at Lights Around Wheeling, the Village's annual holiday lighting event, scheduled to take place at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, November 18 in Friendship Park. As always, the event will feature snacks, entertainment, a visit from Santa, and the lighting of the Village's holiday lights. I and the Village Board of Trustees hope to see you there!

### Health & Nutrition Tips

**Eat an overall healthy diet that includes:**

- **A variety of fruit:** four fruit servings/day (serving = one medium whole fruit)
- **A variety of vegetables:** five vegetable servings/day (serving = one cup leafy) Fresh, frozen, or canned; no salt or low salt.
- **Whole grains:** six servings/day (serving = one slice of bread or one tortilla)
- **Low-fat dairy products:** three servings/day (serving = one cup of milk)
- **Skinless poultry:** nine servings/week (serving = three oz. or equal to the size of a deck of cards)
- **Fish:** two to three servings/week (serving = three oz. or equal to the size of a deck of cards)
- **Nuts and legumes (beans):** five servings/week (serving = one tablespoon peanut butter, ¼ cup cooked beans or peas)
- **Non-tropical vegetable oils:** three servings/day (serving = one tablespoon). Light salad dressing, low-fat mayonnaise (use vegetable oils such as olive, peanut, safflower, sesame, soybean, canola, and sunflower).

## Medicare Open Enrollment

***Ends December 7!***

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year to things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is the time when all people with Medicare can change their health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs. Information for next year's plans will be available beginning in October.

If you are in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan, always review the materials your plans send you, like the "Evidence of Coverage" (EOC) and "Annual Notice of Change" (ANOC). If plans are changing, make sure your plan will still meet your needs for the following year. If you're satisfied with your current plan and it's still being offered, you don't need to do anything.

To find Medicare plan information or compare plans, call 1-800-MEDICARE or visit [medicare.gov](https://www.medicare.gov). Call the Village of Wheeling Human Services Department Senior Services Division at 847.459.2670 for an appointment to find the best prescription drug plan for your individual needs for 2019. Appointments are available during open enrollment on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m.– 3 p.m.

# POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS

## Ambulance Usage: When to call and when not to call

Each year, the Wheeling Fire Department responds to approximately 5,000 emergency calls. Of these, approximately 3,200 are for emergency medical situations. While many of these calls are for problems such as chest pains, difficulty breathing, or serious trauma, unfortunately there are occasionally calls for colds, minor finger injuries, and other trauma-related injuries that could easily be handled with a Band-Aid® or a simple trip to a personal physician's office. These non-essential calls for service result in potential delays to those individuals who may truly need an ambulance, result in backups at area emergency rooms, and often end up costing hundreds of dollars of unnecessary medical bills that may or may not be covered by your health insurance or Medicaid. Current charges for ambulance service range from \$752 to \$1,025, depending upon the nature of the incident. Ambulance service is strictly intended to be an emergency medical service only and not an expedient replacement for routine medical care or treatment that can be easily obtained from a personal physician or regional health clinic.



So, when should you call 9-1-1 for an ambulance? The following general guidelines will help you to make wise use of the department's emergency medical services:

•**Request an ambulance by calling 9-1-1 from either a landline or cellular telephone when:** there is difficulty breathing, chest pains, apparent stroke conditions, loss of consciousness, fractures of long bones (arms or legs) or skull, trauma with entrapment, amputations, extensive blood loss, penetrating injuries of the central core (abdomen, chest, neck, or head), fevers in excess of 101 degrees F lasting more than several hours, 2nd and 3rd degree burns, prescription or illegal drug overdoses, ingestion or inhalation of toxic substances, or any other medical condition that appears to be immediately life-threatening.

•**Do NOT request an ambulance when:** the patient has non-life-threatening injuries or illness such as scrapes, abrasions, bruises, broken fingers or toes, black eyes, minor punctures to the hands or feet, splinters, indigestion, sore backs, sunburn, the flu or a bad cold for the past several days unless it meets the general criteria listed above, sore shoulders, minor rashes/hives affecting only the skin, children with a cold and/or congestion, or any other minor medical condition in which the patient can safely and easily be treated by their personal physician or a regional health clinic, or be transported to the emergency room by private vehicle.

Of course, if you are ever in doubt as to whether or not to call an ambulance, don't wait and immediately call 9-1-1. By making wise use of the Village's emergency medical services, you are helping to make sure the emergency medical services within the Village remain cost-effective and available for everyone when truly needed, controlling your own personal health care costs, and reducing the potential for emergency room overload.

## Change your batteries, save your family

On **Sunday, November 4**, we will once again move our clocks backwards as part of Daylight Savings Time. It is also an excellent reminder to once again change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. These are the hardest-working appliances in your home, protecting your family every second of every day. Make sure they work by changing their batteries (if applicable), vacuuming them, and testing them. If your smoke detectors are more than ten years old—or you are not sure how old they are—replace them with a newer sealed ten-year device. If your carbon monoxide detectors are more than five years old—or you are not sure how old they are—replace them with a newer sealed ten-year device or a newer combination smoke detector/carbon monoxide detector device. All of the newer devices have sealed batteries and no longer require annual replacement; after ten years of use, you just dispose of them. A few minutes of your time now can mean the difference between life and death should a fire occur in your home later on.



# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & PUBLIC WORKS

## Snow Season Procedures

Public Works personnel are preparing for snow control with salt deliveries, vehicle preparation, and year-round training. Snow and ice responsibilities include de-icing and clearing arterial, collector, and residential roadways, certain sections of public sidewalks, bus stops, the train station, and Village-owned buildings and properties.


Public Works is not responsible for the maintenance or snow control on county- or state-owned roadways or rights-of-way. These roadways include:

### \*Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) 847-705-4222

- Dundee Road (Route 68)
- Elmhurst Road (Route 83)
- Milwaukee Avenue (Route 21)
- McHenry Road (Route 83)
- Palatine Road

### \*Driveway Snow Shoveling Recommendations

When shoveling snow at the end of a driveway, place the snow to the right of the driveway (as you face the street) to avoid the snow being pushed back onto the driveway by a snowplow truck. Also, clear a few feet at the edge of the street and curb to the left of the driveway (as you face the street). This will help reduce the amount of snow at the end of the driveway. Refer to the illustration above.

### \*Residents are advised of the following safety tips during the snow season:

- Stay 100 feet or more behind a snowplow or salt truck.
- Shovel snow away from fire hydrants near your property for emergency access.
- Do not place refuse, refuse containers, or any other items in the street.

### \*Vehicle Parking Restrictions

- Do not park on any Village street within eight hours after a snowfall of two inches or more to allow safe and efficient snow and ice control by Public Works.
- Vehicles in violation of this restriction may be towed by the Police Department.

### \*Sidewalk Requirements

- Residents and property owners are responsible for clearing snow and ice from sidewalks adjoining or adjacent to their property by 10 a.m. the day after a snowfall. Property owners are permitted to spread sand, salt, or other substances made for the purpose of melting snow and ice on sidewalks.
- Residents and property owners shall not deposit snow or ice onto any roadway within the Village; instead, deposit snow and ice onto the parkway.

## Guidelines for Leaf Disposal

*Village Code 11.08.100 prohibits the deposit of leaves into streets, roads, or highways, and along the shoulder, curb, or edge of any street, road, or highway.*

- Leaves intentionally raked into such areas can result in clogged storm sewer drains and subsequent flooding.
- The Village's contract with Waste Management provides an alternate, convenient method to dispose of leaves and other forms of yard waste for residents of single-family homes.
- In addition to two-ply Kraft biodegradable paper yard waste bags, residents may use rigid 32-gallon containers clearly marked with a red "X" around the container.
- Containers and biodegradable bags, when filled, may not exceed 45 pounds in weight. There is no limit to the number of yard waste bags or containers allowed.
- Yard waste in plastic bags or cardboard boxes will not be collected.
- Brush must be bundled and tied with biodegradable twine or string. Bundles must not weigh over 45 pounds, exceed four feet in length or two feet in diameter, or contain limbs greater than three inches in diameter. There is no limit to the number of brush bundles allowed.
- Loose or larger brush or logs will not be collected by Waste Management.
- **Yard waste collections conclude on November 30, 2018.**

### Burning Landscape Waste is Illegal in Wheeling

The burning of construction debris, garbage, paper, and landscape waste including leaves, twigs, and damaged tree limbs is not only environmentally unhealthy and prone to causing accidental fires, it is also illegal in Wheeling. Violators are subject to citations and fines. Please use the weekly landscape waste collection program outlined above to dispose of landscape debris.

### Outdoor Fireplace Regulations

- Only dry, well-seasoned natural wood logs may be burned in an approved outdoor fireplace.
- Use in accordance with the manufacturer's operating instructions.
- Keep all portable fireplaces a minimum of 15 feet from combustible structures, playground equipment, and nearby vehicles.
- Never use gasoline to start an outdoor fireplace.
- A responsible adult must remain nearby with a fire extinguisher, bucket of water, or attached garden hose, in case the fire accidentally grows too large or embers ignite anything outside of the fireplace.
- Remember to be a good neighbor when using an outdoor fireplace. Please be respectful and cooperative with your neighbors by extinguishing your outdoor fire place if it adversely impacts your neighbor's health and well-being.

### Protect Water Lines from Freezing

Follow these measures to protect water lines from freezing and prevent water pipes from rupturing during extreme cold:

- Monitor water meters: Wrap water meters with foam insulation or heat tape if located in unheated or colder areas such as crawlspaces. Periodically check your meter and associated piping for cracks or leaks and ensure proper marking and operation of the shut-off valve in case a pipe bursts.
- Eliminate drafts: All crawlspace and basement vents, windows, and doors should be repaired and closed, making sure a tight seal exists to keep out cold air.
- Insulate pipes: Insulating pipes in colder or unheated areas such as the crawlspace, or pipes located adjacent to an outside wall, helps to reduce the possibility of ruptured pipes. Allow warm air to circulate around pipes that are accessed by cabinets or located against outside walls.
- Leave faucets running: A continuous trickle of cold water can help reduce the possibility of a pipe bursting due to freezing.

If you know that a property has been unoccupied for several days, contact the Public Works Utility Division at 847.279.6900 so they can determine whether water services are shut off at the property. This can prevent costly damage to the unoccupied property.

## Holiday Lights Recycling Program

Residents may recycle holiday lights—including mini, C7, C9, rope, and LED lights, as well as extension cords of all colors and lengths—at the Department of Public Works, 77 W. Hintz Road, November 1, 2018 to February 1, 2019, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Garland, live greens, wreaths, and other non-recyclables are not accepted in this recycling program. ## Holiday Tree Collections

Non-artificial holiday trees are collected at residential curbsides by Waste Management during the first two weeks in January at no additional charge. Trees that have decorations or are in stands or plastic bags will not be collected.

## Holiday Solid Waste Collection Reminder

In observance of Thanksgiving Day, November 22, 2018, and Christmas Day, December 25, 2018, solid waste collections will be delayed by one day.

## Electrical Power Outages

Seasonal storms, high winds, damaged trees, and even wildlife can cause occasional loss of electrical power. When the lights go, please do not call 9-1-1. The Village of Wheeling has no control over the loss of electrical power or when it will be restored to your home. Calling 9-1-1 potentially delays true emergency situations from being addressed in a timely manner and needlessly ties up limited Village resources; 9-1-1 should only be called for actual emergencies such as fires, injuries, or entrapments, or when individuals are at immediate risk. Following these steps during storms.

### Stay Safe

- Don't light candles, they could start a fire.
- Don't use a gas cooking range for emergency heating; it could build up deadly carbon monoxide fumes.
- Turn off or unplug electronic equipment and appliances.
- Always use a metal screen over fireplace openings and clear the hearth of any materials to catch flying sparks.

### Keep Snow and Ice Clear

- During winter storms, always clear ice and snow from ventilation pipes for direct-vent furnaces and water heaters.
- Residents with electric heat pumps should clear snow and ice away from their units so that it can function properly.
- Keep dryer vents clear of snow and ice.
- Use a broom or brush to remove ice and snow from outside meters and attached equipment to keep them from potentially malfunctioning or interfering with service.

### Use Generators Properly

- Carefully follow manufacturer's instructions when using your generator.
- To avoid carbon monoxide poisoning, never use a generator inside your home or in an attached garage. Generators should only be used outside in well-ventilated, dry areas, away from air intakes into the home.
- If your generator needs to be wired directly into your home's electrical system, use a licensed electrician for the work.
- If your generator is connected directly to your home's electrical system, please turn off the main circuit breaker to avoid potential injury to crews working to restore power.






